Summer 2017 Courses

*****Please note: Not all APPLES service-learning courses fulfill the experiential education requirement. Courses fulfilling this requirement will be indicated with an EE designation with the description. Students enrolled in Summer Session I courses have through the end of Summer Session II to complete service hours according to the Summer School. All APPLES courses require a minimum of 30 hours of service.**

EDUC 617 (01M) Teaching in the Middle School

This course is required for candidates who seek North Carolina licensure to teach at the middle school level and open for others interested in exploring teaching or gaining experience working in a school setting with young adolescent learners. The course provides students with an introduction to the history, philosophy and attributes of schools and curriculum specifically designed for young adolescents with attention to their developmental characteristics and needs as learners. This is an opportunity for students to gain experience working as trained AVID tutors in area middle schools while learning about adolescent development, the structures of middle level schooling and best practices for working with students aged 10 -14. Students do not have to be admitted to the School of Education to enroll. EE

MUSC 269 (001) Music in the Community

This course connects academic inquiry in community music with an experiential project in the making, organization or documentation of music locally. Summer session I, EE

SOWO 492 Seminar in Service-Learning

Charity Watkins

This is a one-credit hour course offered by Carolina Courses Online and is only open to students who have been selected for a summer APPLES internship. This course investigates pervasive social issues occurring locally, nationally and globally as well as the theoretical and personal exploration of values guiding provision of services to individuals and communities. As part of the course, students complete an intensive, paid internship experience in a local nonprofit agency. Applications are closed. Summer session I, EE

SPAN 293 (01M) Spanish Service-Learning

Students enrolled in SPAN 333 will have the option to enroll in SPAN 293 during the first week of class. Service-learning component for students enrolled in select Spanish language service-learning courses. May not count toward the major or minor in Spanish. Summer session I, EE

SPAN 255 (001) Cinema for Spanish Conversation

Students expand speaking, writing, vocabulary and grammar through analysis of Hispanic film. Discussion of global issues (drugs, immigration, cultural adaptations) and diversity (gender issues, class, regional and religious differences) in Spanish-speaking countries. Students may enroll in SPAN 293 for additional EE credit. Summer session I. This course by itself does not fulfill EE.
