# PROGRAM COMPONENTS

---

As a Community Service Scholar, you receive a partial scholarship along with training, mentorship and support in pursuing your public service interests.



**\$5,000 annual scholarship**, renewable for up to three years

Enrollment in the **Buckley Public Service Scholars** program, which includes **skills trainings** related to public service and a structure for **tracking** and **reflecting on service**



Completion of an average of **250 hours** of service per year during your time in the program



A four-day leadership development course through the **North Carolina Outward Bound School** over fall break

Access to CCPS staff for **mentoring** and other forms of support

In your junior or senior year, you'll matriculate into the **MacDonald Community Fellowship** program. In this fellowship, you'll work with a community partner to identify a capstone service project to complete by the time you graduate. CCPS provides resources to help you develop and implement your project, including up to \$1,500 for related costs.
